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### **Editors Comments**

Yes, we have changed the name of the newsletter. The word 'diakrisis' is a Greek word meaning 'discernment'. It means to separate one from another; to divide or part; to distinguish. 'Diakrisis' is made up of 'Krisis' - to judge, and 'Dia' - through. It therefore means to judge through something with the intent of separating the thing to see what is good and evil, or truth and error. To discern means 'to have the ability to see what is not evident to the average mind'.\* It is this ability that we believe the church has largely lost, especially in recent years.

We have recently received many encouraging letters from Christians who identify with what we are writing. Many see the need to *earnestly contend for the faith which* was once delivered unto the saints, (Jude 3).

However, this must be done in love or it is fruitless; with humility or it is carnal; with integrity and knowledge or it becomes dishonesty full of half truths. Half truths are worse than no truth. Many of the cults have an abundance of half truths and yet are more deceptive than outright devil worship. We must also be careful not to pull things 'out of the air' or from dubious sources, to support our doctrine or stance on any one issue. I pray that we in this ministry will be as accurate as is humanly possible.

When witnessing to the cults or people involved in false teaching, it is important to keep all of the above in mind, but also to feed them *milk* before we give them *meat*. If you shine a bright light into someone's eyes who has not seen light for some time, you will make them retreat from the very light that they need.

Many people caught up in false teachings of which we expose in our newsletters, are *Christians*. They are our *brethren*! Although Paul rebuked the Corinthians for carnality, selfishness, false teaching and practices, he called them *saints* and *brethren*, (1Cor.1:2; 13:6). In Mark 9:38,39 Jesus reminded John to recognise others, (who were not following the disciples but doing the Lord's work), as Christians. Rather than judge a person's salvation we would do better to test the fruit. If what is being said and done or taught is unbiblical, then we are commanded to separate from it.

## A Report on the State of the Charismatic church

At the beginning of 1995 Charismatic leaders in England issued a report on the direction they believed the Charismatic church had recently gone. The following is an adaptation of part of their report.\*

In the 1940's William Branham prophesied a great worldwide end-time revival. This would come by a second Pentecost Latter-Rain church which would be separated from the denominations to conquer the world. Branham taught that God was raising up apostles and prophets to resurrect a new church in the new age to come. He taught that the wicked would be removed from the earth, (N.B.: opposite to rapture theory), and that this elite group would reign on earth. In 1949 the Assemblies of God, after much deliberation, finally declared these teachings to be heretical. However, by the early 1970's these teachings had resurfaced in the teachings called 'restorationism' and 'Dominionism'. Bob Jones, of the 'Kansas City Prophets', (later involved with the Vineyard Movement), taught that the children of believers born since 1973 would make up this end-time church. This generation would have powers greater than the apostles, and would conquer nations, and even control major institutions to take the land for Jesus.

Bob Jones was later to fall in gross sexual sin. However, to continue the deception there came many 'waves' of the 'spirit' with their usual prohecies and promises. Each wave has taken the Charismatic church further away from a scriptural base, with more emphasis on experience and less emphasis on the mind. The 'Toronto Blessing' is the latest and strongest of these waves.

In the 1980's Paul Cain, a disciple of Branham, prophesied that a mighty revival would take place in Britain beginning June, 1990. This was revised later to come into line with a visit by John Wimber in October, 1990. Wimber, as well as Bob Jones and several leading Charismatic leaders, embraced this prophecy which later proved to be false. Bob Jones also had prophesied that God was raising up a 300 strong army of 'overcomers' to defeat the enemies of Christ and to prepare the way for the second coming.

These false prophecies have continued down through the years, usually without repentance. This is the stuff that makes cults! Jim Jones, David Koresh and Moses Berg are examples of prophecies taken to their limits, and thousands were affected adversely, even to unnecessary deaths.

Rodney Howard-Browne openly teaches that the manifestations at the Toronto type meetings are evidence of 'Latter rain' and a 'second Pentecost'. The Gospel being preached at these meetings is not centred on the cross nor repentance. When Howard-Browne shared a platform with Kenneth Copeland he gave prophecies that people at the meeting would be different afterwards, and that outsiders would fall at their feet in shopping malls etc. This simply has not taken place. The church is in perilous times!

# 'Toronto Blessing' News

- Charismatic Clifford Hill from England writes:'there are signs that the Toronto 'wave' is ebbing. People no longer flock to meetings. The prophecies of a great revival remain unfulfilled. The so-called 'refreshment' has proved equally false, with some leaders exhausted and others suffering severe headaches and depression....people are beginning to search the scriptures for themselves, to see if there really is any support for prophecies of an end-time signs and wonders revival. It is this 'Latter Rain' teaching at the heart of the Toronto message which appears to have been rejected by John Wimber...Only about 15% of church-goers, according to a recent survey, read their Bible regulary. Thus they do not know when they are following leaders who are giving false teaching...the majority of believers do not have sufficient knowledge of the Bible to be able to discern truth from deception'. ('Prophecy Today, Vol.12, No.2 by Clifford Hill)
- Arnold G. Fruchtenbaum, Co-Director of Ariel Ministries writes: 'God will certainly do what he must to strip people of their pride and humble them, but He will never strip them of their dignity in light of the fact that man still has the image of God in him. Another man wrote to me and said that what he sees is that God is now 'taking back His church'. How people making animal noises and uncontrollable laughter could possibly be construed as evidence that God 'is taking back His church' is certainly a point beyond belief....Matthew 7:22-23 (says) Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity... They will be able to do three specific things:prophesy events which did come to pass; cast out demons; and do many mighty works, such as miracles of healing and other signs and wonders. Yet, in that day, Jesus said to them: I never knew you. Here, you have all the ingredients of some of the things that are happening in Toronto, Kansas city, and elsewhere... Satan can duplicate these...But the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils;...Satan would not be very successful in

his program of deception if his strategy was to make people feel bad. That is not going to attract much of an audience..1Corinthians 4:6 (Says)...that ye might learn in us not to think (of men) above that which is written...Paul is saying this to a church which had a strong tendency to move towards the sensational and the experiential... The fact is: the laughing phenomenon and the animal noise phenomenon is found nowhere in scripture. It is something that goes beyond that which is written and must be rejected out of hand.. And what happens to those who do go beyond that which is written? Paul declares that they become puffed up for one against another... As a result they divide all believers into two categories: those who have 'it', and those who do not.. A Charismatic speaker who causes people to become hysterical or act like animals or fall down can fill up whole stadiums with thousands upon thousands of people, who will eventually also be asked to empty their pockets for the offering...Pauls tells us the result of not enduring sound doctrine and pursuing false teachers(2Tim.4:v.4): first, they will turn away their ears from the truth, and secondly, they will turn unto fables. What are fables? Fables are, again, teachings and doctrines outside of Scripture. (Ariel Ministries, 'The Toronto Phenomenon by Arnold Fruchtenbaum, Th.M., Ph.D.)

- A Rev. Gordon Williams writes:...I had encountered this 'roaring' hundreds of times in meetings and church services over the years. And I can assure you, it was not caused by the Holy Spirit, except in that it was the anguish or the torment (Mk.5:7), that the demon or evil spirit was experiencing as it possessed or harassed the person...Does a spring send forth fresh water and bitter from the same opening? Can a fig tree, my brethren, bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? No spring yields both salt water and fresh (James 3:10-12),..If there is both blessing and curse coming from any ministry then it must be examined in order to see why. Uncontrollable shaking is not a work of the Holy Spirit. According to the fruit of the Spirit the opposite is the case: self control (Gal.5:23)...During the early days of Pentecost, uncontrollable shaking was seen as an excess of the flesh or a counter-work of the enemy...

### What is a fundamentalist?

I once was talking to a dear Christian friend who was concerned that I was 'drifting' towards being a 'fundamentalist'. I was disturbed, not because of the statement, but because of the person's lack of understanding of what the term 'fundamentalist' means.

What is a fundamentalist? Many people when they hear this term conjure up images of wild-eyed Muslims or Islamic invaders. Others have some strange idea of Christian sects who are anti everything else that Christians are for. In very simple and general terms the word means getting *back to basics*. The term was originally used to describe the *Christian* who earnestly believed in the *literal truth* of the Bible!

In 1909 a group of Christians met at a Niagra Bible conference. Following this, in 1895 they wrote a summary of 'fundamentals'. There were five standards of Christian belief: 1. The inerrancy of the Bible 2. The Virgin Birth of Jesus 3. The substitutionary atonement 4. The physical resurrection of Jesus 5. The imminent return to earth of Jesus Christ. These fundamentals were embraced by many denominations, especially Baptists and Presbyterians, in an effort to oppose the rising tide of 'modernist' teaching. This new 'modernist' influence included liberalism, Darwinism and evolution. 'Fundamentalists' were vocal against evolution in schools and strongly opposed to liberalism.

Today, however, the term 'fundamentalist' often has a negative bias partly because most Christians are ignorant of what fundamentalists really believe. It is my opinion that any person who correctly and truly searches for truth among the mish-mash of teachings within today's church will eventually get to roots that are unshakable. These roots will be growing out of 'infallible' soil - The Bible! Yet many will accuse them of 'fundamentalism'. Many who accuse others of being fundamentalist are ideally or in theory fundamentalists themselves!

Personally I don't call myself a fundamentalist because most people are ignorant of its meaning and use. However, if we correctly take the Bible as wholly true and without fault, and are committed to living by it, and testing what we believe by it, are we not 'fundamentalists'? Terry Arnold

# Book Reviews by Mike Claydon

'Making War in the Heavenlies' & 'Weighed and Found Wanting' by Charismatic Pastor Bill Randles, (imported & distributed by TA Ministries)

I read both in two sittings! I was unable to put them down because of the exciting exegesis of scriptures that had bothered me! 'Making War in the Heavenlies' deals with a subject close to my heart - 'Spiritual Warfare'. Randles deals with the current heresies doing the rounds in America and Australia with all the attendant theories, such as spiritual mapping, prayer walks, ancestor traits, etc. The teachings of Paul are put into stark perspective with regard to this activity, and by a scholarly opening of the Greek texts the author brings out the true meaning of the words written on this vital aspect of the believer's life.

'Weighed and Found wanting' deals with the current phenomenon of the 'Toronto Blessing'. Again Randles unfolds scripture in an authoritative and convincing manner and helped to crystalise much of my concerned thinking about all these new teachings and happenings in the church world-wide. For anyone interested in an in depth study of the history and roots of the T.B. phenomena this book is a classic reference book. On a recent interview on a shortwave outreach radio programme, he sounded as clear headed and intelligent as his writings - I urge anyone who is questioning these activities to read both these books.

### The other side of Azusa St.

Many Pentecostals cite the famous Azusa St. revival as the restoration of the gifts of the Holy Spirit and the roots of the Pentecostal movement. It was here in 1906 in Los Angelos that many are said to have received the 'Baptism in the Spirit' with the use of various gifts of the spirit including tongues. At this time 'fundamentalist' Christians immediately opposed many things involved with the events of Azusa St., believing it to be too subjective and a false source of revelation.

At Azusa St. W.J. Seymour, a student of Charles Parham, began a series of meetings that were to run for over three years. What is not widely reported is that when Charles Parham was asked by Seymour to come to assess the situation he found much that resembled the Corinthian church.

Parham found it difficult to distinguish between the true and the false use of the gifts. He found 'hypnotic influences, familiar spirit influences, spiritualistic influences, mesmeric influences and all kinds of spells and spasms, falling in trances, etc. All of these things are foreign to and unknown [the Apostolic faith movement] outside of Los Angelos, except in the places visited by the workers sent out from this city.'\* Parham later denounced the movement as a case of 'awful fits and spasms' and of 'holy rollers and hypnotists'. \*\* The Azusa St. Mission was in fact terminated by 1911.

Other accounts of Azusa St. show that there was a decrease in the preaching. One writer, (writing in favour of the 'Toronto Blessing'), admits that, 'Where the Welsh revival went wrong, and Azusa St. too, was in its repudiation of sound and dynamic instruction from the Word of God.' \*\*\*

Bartleman in his book, 'What really happened at Azusa St.', (1925), rejoices that, 'No attempt was made to preach. A few messages were given by the Spirit'. He also states that the intellect was regarded as thoroughly polluted by sin and that the mind was 'the last fortress of man to yield'. Theologians were also regarded with great suspicion. It is interesting to note that theses same features are present in the current 'Toronto Blessing'! Terry Arnold

# An Ex-Mason testifies
