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Editors Comments

Last months editorial wrote of love and truth but focused on love and its sister, compassion. That is a *positive* message to all. This week let us focus back on truth, for it is the truth that sets people free! (Jn.8:32) To tell the truth is sometimes *negative*. Are we too negative in this newsletter?... Was Paul too negative?... Was Jeremiah too negative? These men who were few in number preached repentance and warned of God's judgement when the 'positive' (false) prophets promised peace and prosperity! Gods Word burned in Jeremiah's bones and he had to speak it out, (Jer.20). Similarly, Paul constantly exposed false teaching, false teachers and false prophets. He mentioned *doctrine* at least 26 times in his epistles, (at least 13 in the epistles to Timothy alone!). Jesus preached repentance, sin, hell, and judgement to come. He called the religious leaders fools, hypocrites, whited sepulchres and blind leaders leading the blind. He and Paul would be banned from most pulpits today! They perhaps would also have had unpopular *newsletters* today!

Positive or negative is not the issue. The issue is truth and obedience to the purity of doctrine and the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Ezekiel was another who was not popular and did not have a popular message, but warned and prophesied of judgement, (Ezek.3:17). In his day a remnant were saved, (6:8; 14:22). The book of Ezekiel tells of the prophets of the day prophesying '*out of their own hearts...foolish prophets that follow their own spirits and have seen nothing*', (13:2,3). Because Israel listened to these prophets, Israel became a '*reproach to the nations*', (22:4). The ministers of Israel had neglected to show the '*difference between the holy and the profane...between the unclean and the clean*', (22:26). Because of this, a chosen remnant would '*teach my people the difference between the holy and the profane and cause them to discern between the unclean and the clean and in controversy they shall stand in judgement*', (44:23)

I do not enjoy controversy. This ministry never set out to be controversial. It is always first a teaching ministry, but with teaching comes controversy. It is unavoidable. Teaching incurs absolutes because the Bible is full of absolutes. Truth has absolutes, error has none. Truth loses friends and I have lost friends. Some say this ministry is working for the devil, or is bigoted. None that make this charge have entered into face to face dialogue. Others cannot fault the material but do not want certain leaders or their errors exposed. Most of the controversial issues this ministry teaches on are those that affect the Gospel or the purity of doctrine. Yes, doctrinal controversy may cause division but this will be because someone has firstly introduced an *addition* to the '*faith once delivered to the saints*', (Jude 3)! If doctrine divides it is because truth divides!

At TA Ministries and through *Diakrisis* we attempt to alert Christians to false teaching and encourage them to go back to the Bible and to test all things. I believe we are living in days when to preach the Gospel with the usual terminologies may not be enough. Satan has sowed so much confusion and counterfeiting of terms that I believe it is now more than ever before necessary to explain more clearly the terms of the Gospel of salvation. But *further* to this, it is also vital that we show *what it is not*.

What Is The Gospel?

The above question should be easily answered by most Christians. However, I have consistently found that many are confused as to what are the key points of the Gospel. Many limit this so much that it becomes 'easy believism'. Others add to it thereby polluting it such that it may well become '*another Gospel*', (2Cor.11:4; Gal.1:6). The Gospel basically means 'good news', but what is not often recognised today is that before one can accept the good news they *must* have revelation knowledge and conviction of the 'bad news'. The bad news is that we are sinners deserving the penalty under a perfect law set by a holy and righteous judge. The good news of Jesus Christ and the work of the cross can only be appropriated and inherited when we first realise what we are saved *from* - ie. '*The wrath of God*' upon sin, (Rom.5:9; Jn.3:36; Matt.3:7; Lk.3:7). Below is a Gospel summary and a study guide. We encourage readers to study the following points that we might know what to share, preach and teach.

The message (the Gospel) of God is: That Jesus Christ came as God (*Deity*) in the flesh and humbled Himself to die (a *substitute*) in our place as a *sinless, perfect, and finished* sacrifice, and through His *blood* to pay the penalty (*redemption*) of our guilt (*sin*). He rose from the dead in the (*resurrection*) power of the Holy Spirit to declare (*impute*) His righteousness to those who will believe and trust Him as *Lord and Saviour*. His offer is *eternal life* to sinners who *repent and have faith in who He is and what He did*.

Haville on Signs and Wonders

'I was being trained for leadership and was nearer to the leaders than the average man in the pew. We had the most 'anointed' men of God on the planet yet they were none the better for it. I don't think I was ever in a service where someone didn't give their life to the Lord - yet you never saw most of these 'converts' again. I think they had perfected the art of getting people to make a decision; but I don't think they were converted. We used to have what I call the half-Gospel - according to Romans 10. Romans 10 for me says that what a person believes in his heart and confesses with his mouth is what affects salvation. What actually happened was that we would get them down to the front and have them repeat a sinners prayer. Sin was never explained. Nor was repentance - you just assumed that you had done things which were wrong. When mixed together with a highly emotional element - entertainment, music, peer pressure and crowd control - you could easily get people down to the front. But they didn't believe it in their heart, they only confessed it with their mouth....

Its pretty exciting stuff. You experience adrenaline rushes and live off your emotions. The trouble with those 'wonderful' feelings is that they make very good servants but poor masters. It is no different to being a pop singer. You have this crowd literally in your hands, hanging on every word. It is very exciting but not an anointing from God. The Bible is more about holiness than happiness and we found that as long as you create the right atmosphere you can produce the manifestations...When I see some well fed evangelist go to India preaching to crowds of people who are just one meal away from starvation and they take an offering - I just cry. There is a side to these people which their followers don't see. Its heartbreaking...The 'buzz' that people need is not 'power encounters' but to discover Jesus for themselves in the Scriptures; that little nugget which you've mined for yourself and no one has shown you. I want to teach people how to dig and find God in their own lives.' (Excerpts from an interview with Mark Haville, author of '*Signs and Wonders - Exposed*'; cited in *Prophecy Today*, Vol.14, No.1. Mark was originally a Signs and Wonders preacher. On our tape '*Toronto Blessing 3D*', which shows the fruit of this 'blessing', Mark Haville is seen in his old days '*slaying people in the spirit*'. Critic Meets Pensacola Enthusiasts

Recently author Hank Hanegraaff from the *Christian Research Institute* (CRI) accepted an invitation to the Pensacola Brownsville church to speak to the student body. Hanegraaff has been an outspoken critic of the revival and has written books critiquing it as a counterfeit revival.

The Assembly of God and other portions of the pro-Pensacola lobby wrote this up as a 'reconciliation' between the two parties. Other reports stated that Hanegraaff had been 'slain in the spirit' and had experienced manifestations.

Hanegraaff has since set the record straight by stating: '*I continue to be concerned about the physical and spiritual consequences of unbiblical manifestations such as spasmodic jerking and being 'slain in the spirit'...I remain concerned that the Brownsville revival is indicative of a paradigm shift taking place within Christianity - a shift from faith to feelings, from fact to fancy, and from reason to esoteric revelation. This shift is what I call the counterfeit revival...as John Wesley...stated, '...to renounce reason is to renounce religion,...all irrational religion is false religion'. Wesley...attributed enthusiasm such as falling, jumping, and jerking,...to the ploys of Satan. ...'*

Pensacola Exposed by Local Journalists

The *Pensacola News Journal** is systematically exposing the Pensacola 'Revival' to be one of the greatest shams of the Charismatic world. The investigations have revealed that:

- The revival was not spontaneous but introduced carefully by Kilpatrick, who threatened to quit if the church refused it.
- Millions of dollars are unaccounted for and Church members are not now allowed to see the church books.

- Claims of support to missionaries are false. Steve Hill gave names of foreign missions to journalists, one of which when contacted had not heard from Hill in *ten years*.

Flashback: Pensacola - Kilpatrick's Prophecy (6/4/97)

'I want to close by giving ten proclamations...Mr Hanegraaff, and all other devils, listen up'

Number 1: *This revival...I'm saying this for the ears of God...This revival shall not diminish and this revival shall turn into a national awakening.*

Number 2: *..millions in America will come to Christ.*

Number 3: *...Lord hear this one: that God shall give us the necessary lands and buildings and technology to facilitate...*

Number 4: *All moneys needed...shall roll in abundantly...*

Number 5: *That the number that's presently out there on our marquee by the road of over 100,000 people that have made decisions for Christ shall in a short period of time to come, because of the great awakening and because of God's power about to fall in an unprecedented way from the Whitehouse to Pensacola, from Maine to California, and from Washington to Florida, that the numbers shall change in the near future from over 100,000 to millions...I said millions, millions, millions, millions, millions!...*

Number 6: *That no weapon that is formed against Steve Hill or myself or this major outpouring... shall prosper...if a bomb is brought on this campus, I make a proclamation, Lord, it shall never, ever go off, in the name of Jesus.*

Number 8: *..The church...Brownsville AOG shall maintain it's integrity...*

Number 9: *supernatural, divine, Holy Ghost healings and deliverances and signs and wonders begin to drastically increase...*

Number 10: *the hour is drawing nigh for the soon-coming of our Lord Jesus...'*

Editors Comments: A number of these have already been proven false. The '*national awakening*' is not evident and the opposite is shown in statistics. The areas designated have not seen revival. Hill and Kilpatrick both suffered serious injuries about the same time and were not healed. The integrity of the church is in serious question. The *Pensacola Journal* has exposed a financial scam in at least the area of tax evasion - (Kilpatrick and Hill have since paid overdue sales tax). Healings and signs and wonders have *not* increased. Investigators have found not one single case of genuine healing from the small number of the best cases sent to them by Brownsville. Some have been exposed as outright false healings.

Quotable

Nicky Gumbel is the leader and promoter of the *Alpha* course. People doing the *Alpha* course on a weekend away are told: '*Sometimes when people are filled, they shake like a leaf in the wind...physical heat sometimes accompanies the filling of the Spirit and people experience it in their hands or some other part of their bodies...[or] experience 'liquid heat'...*' (Gumbel, 1994:No.136)

Editors comments: These *imparted* manifestations have simply no scriptural warrant and nothing to do with the filling by the Spirit. The New Testament is absolutely devoid of these things. This is pure auto suggestion and primes the participants to expect unscriptural experiences. (See *Diakrisis* Jan & March issues for more on *Alpha*)

Saved By Faith Or Works?

In a recent nationwide American survey people were asked questions about salvation by faith or works. More than 55% said a good person can earn salvation. A breakdown was as follows: 22% Assembly of God; Baptist 38%; Presbyterian 52%; Lutheran 54%; Episcopalian (Anglican) 5%; Methodist 59%; Mormon 76%; Catholic 82%. (*Moody, March/April 1998*)

Editors Comments: This is one of the burdens of my heart! - that we would again teach Justification by faith alone without works which includes the *imputed* (credited) *righteousness of Christ*. A good place to start is Roman Chapter 4. Those who are interested to be on solid ground in this subject, we encourage the purchase of the recent Sydney seminar tape on '*Justification*', (see *Diakrisis* Aug/98).

The Question of John 3:5,6

'Jesus answered, verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit' (Jn.3:5,6)

This passage of scripture has always intrigued me and I have refrained from a definite viewpoint. There are three main areas of thinking on this verse. 1. That the water is a physical element and that one must be baptised in water to enter into the kingdom. 2. The water is figurative of the Word of God, and 3. The water is the waters of child birth.

The first premise is contradicted by much Scripture that proves that water baptism is not essential for salvation. Scripture must interpret Scripture. The account of the penitent thief is the obvious Scripture to refute the false teaching of 'Baptismal Regeneration', (that baptism is necessary for salvation). Much of this teaching can be traced back to about AD370 when infants were baptised with the intent of salvation. The practise became compulsory in the Roman Empire in AD416. Jesus did not say to be '*born of water baptism*' but of '*water*'. Added to this, although many believe it is a command to be baptised, it is a fact that many were saved or forgiven without water baptism, (Matt.9:1-7,22; Mk.5:34; 10:52; Lk.7:48; 17:19; 18:9-14, etc). Water baptism is not *essential* for salvation, (1Cor.1:13-24; 15:1-5; Rom.1:16; 10:9-14; Eph.2:8,9; Acts 10:43; 13:38,39; 16:31; Jn.3:14-18,36; 5:24; 1Jn.5:1).

The second premise is that the '*water*' in Jn.3:5 is *figurative* of and referring to the Word of God. Indeed the Bible does refer to us being sanctified and cleansed '*by the washing of the water by the Word*', (Eph.5:26); '*by the washing of regeneration*', (Tit 3:5). The Word of God is likened to a washing agent. We are told that we are '*born again...by the Word of God*', (1Pet.1:23-25). Many commentators hold this view.

The third premise is that the water is the water of child birth. In the previous verse (vs.4), Nicodemus had asked Jesus about the absurdity of '*entering the womb a second time*'. Jesus goes on to say that what '*is born of flesh is flesh*' (vs.6) - perhaps referring to natural birth from the womb. The preposition '*ek*' used in this verse is translated '*from*'. A transliteration from the Greek is: '*from the flesh, flesh is*'. This same preposition '*ek*' is used in Matt. 19:12: '*from (ek) the womb of a mother*'. Some translations in fact translate this as '*out of water*'. Without making too much from this, it is at least obvious that the spiritual is being contrasted with the physical in these verses of Jn.3. Jesus also went on to say in verse 12: '*If I have told you earthly things, and you believe not, how shall you believe, if I tell you of heavenly [spiritual] things*'.

In verse three of John 3 the '*of*' ('*ex*') is in *italics* meaning it is not in the original Greek. Thus the preposition '*of*' belongs to *both* 'water' and 'spirit'. Some commentators believe that this perhaps means that no one can be born of the spirit unless they are born in human birth first. Angels cannot be born again and no mention is ever made of such because they are spirit and are not born or saved as we are. Similarly it is false to say, as Word-Faith teachers do, that Jesus had to be born again. Jesus existed prior to birth through Mary but was not just human as we are but both 100% human and 100% God.

Let the reader consider the above three positions. Whatever the '*water*' is referring to, we are motivated to be spiritual and to walk in the spirit and not in the flesh, (Rom.8:1,4). Jesus said '*the flesh profiteth nothing; the words I speak unto you they are spirit and they are life*', (Jn.6:63). Terry Arnold

Marian Literature

Recently there has been a flood of literature and interest in the Catholic Mary and the related apparitions. One booklet '*Mary's Apparitions - 1061 to 1998*', (written by a protestant!), states: '*Mother Mary is indeed the white lily of the Trinity. She serves Jesus her Lord and master, as she did during her earthly lifetime. The Holy Spirit is speaking to us through Mary, and I urge you to put aside man-made divisions.*

In another booklet, '*Mary and the Bible*' by the same author, states: '*To be the Mother of our Lord she had to be a pure soul; free of the stain of sin, for indeed she was destined to become our new Eve...The Devil had him [Jesus] at his mercy... [Jesus] gave us Mary - His mother*'.

At the back of the booklet is a list of the ten commandments with number two *missing* and number ten split into two to make up ten. (Catholic ten commandments are not the same as in the Bible. Number two was deleted for obvious reasons).

'*Failure to relate to both God's glory, and Christ's Lordship has reduced the powerful Gospel into a Sunday morning, 'Lets make a deal' crap [lottery] shoot in the houses of religion! All kinds of tactics are used to try to get men to accept the deal offered them by some mental energy they identify as faith! ****New Video**** (\$9.50)

TA Ministries has put together a new 3 part video. All are short segments but designed to be informative and to shock the closed minded.

In part 1 '*Clips to Shock*' is a 14 minute segment showing clips from the 'Toronto Blessing', the 'Pensacola outpouring' and various signs and wonders leaders, including Hagin and Copeland. Some of these clips should leave no doubt as to who is controlling these people.

Part 2 is a documentary from the British TV station '3D', in which the 'Toronto Blessing' is looked at for its *fruit*. Several people are interviewed and their stories told.

Part 3 is '*Godstuff*', a cynical look at what the world sees in TV evangelism. Although some might not appreciate this video, there are several important clips that unmask various signs and wonders and TV evangelists, including Robert Tilton saying '*Satan told me*'. This video is hard evidence that could open closed minds.

Benny Hinn - Law Suit

The latest on the civil rights law suit against Benny Hinn is that approximately ten people are suing for around \$1 million each. The case has been deferred to November 1998. A number of officers from the Florida Sheriffs office department have already lost their jobs.

Hypnotism

'People such as Kenneth Copeland, Kenneth Hagin Jr, Rodney Howard-Browne, Benny Hinn, John Arnott, together with Sandy Millar and David Pyches and many others are practising hypnotism at their meetings. On seeing the video material of their activities, anyone professionally familiar with stage hypnotism will tell you that that is what is going on'. Robert Schuller Charged

Robert Schuller has been charged with physically assaulting an airline flight attendant. Reports from several news organisations report that he became angry when a flight attendant refused to serve him some cheese. Schuller apparently shook the attendant by the shoulders. Schuller was taken to court and fined \$1,200 and apologised to the crew. However, when questioned by reporters he refused to acknowledge guilt and stated that he had not broken one of the ten commandments. (*'Flashpoint'*, USA)

Apostasy Summary

'So many Christians today are (often in ignorance) attempting to attain equality with God - the original sin. They 'reclaim the ground' and 'take on territorial spirits' ('March for Jesus'), they put the Devil 'under their heel' ('revivalism'), they 'pray in their faith' ('Alpha' course) and keep 'steps to belief' ('Promise Keepers'), they 'speak things into being' ('Word Faith'), they claim the 'anointing', the experience that brings them to 'a new level of faith', (Charismatic teaching). Yet they may have no knowledge of God's written Word. But what they are, so they arrogantly believe, outranks anyone who merely believes the teachings of God's Word and puts them into practice. Instead of humble doers of the Word of God, today we are arrogant experience-seekers raging in the face of God' (CRN Journal Spring/98, P.8.)

Holiness

'It is 'the little foxes that spoil the vines', (Song of Solomon 2:15). It is compromise on the little issues that leads to greater downfalls..' ('Pursuit of Holiness' by Jerry Bridges, P.23)

Neo-Evangelicalism

'There is growing concern among many Christians that a wide spread departure from orthodox belief and practice is taking place within the contemporary church. Over the last century the face of evangelicalism has changed beyond recognition as churches have increasingly embraced a variety of non-biblical beliefs and practices. The inerrancy and infallibility of Scripture have been challenged. Justification by grace through faith alone has been obscured. A spurious ecumenism is gathering pace and the importation of New Age thinking and methods is wreaking havoc and confusion.

What is worse, much of it has been smuggled in camouflaged with evangelical language. While Biblical justification is claimed for these new approaches, the truth is that they are light years away from the evangelicism of the reformers and the Puritans. It is a poor imitation accurately dubbed by some a 'neo-evangelicalism'. Left unchecked, it will leave the church unrecognisable and barely Christian in a matter of years.' (Statement by Christian Research Network)

'Near Death Experiences' - Deception?

'Dr.H.Leon Greene, a Christian cardiologist and professor of medicine (Uni. of Wash.), in a new book says the human brain can be induced, (by raising Carbon Dioxide levels in the blood, eg.), to produce the same experiences reported by near death experiences (NDE) proponents: bright lights, a sense of detachment, a feeling of spiritual ecstasy, etc. (World 5/6).

Greene is sceptical of NDE's as proof of the New Age message that death is peaceful; that there is no judgement; that God doesn't care about sin; that all religions get you to the same place. He observes that hardly anybody reports visiting Hell. He says God might give visions, but that NDE's are deceptive and no proof of an afterlife. Christians must rely on the Bible as their authority on the topic - not New Age pop psychologies. Be warned, be wise, beware!' (Remnant, Vol.2, No.7, 7/98)

TV

'The average TV viewer spends 5.5 hours per day watching TV...In the USA children 3-5 years old spend 54 hours every week watching TV, which is 64% of their time awake...With the exception of sleeping, the average American will spend more time in his life watching TV than anything else - yes, even more than working...' (Aust Beacon, Aug/98)

The Christian, the Gospel & the World

Today many churches use worldly methods in an attempt to bring the world to the Gospel. They become like 'PR officers' to make the Gospel acceptable to the world. We need to remind ourselves what the Bible says of the world: ***'If you were of the world the world would love his own but because you are not of the world but I have chosen you out of the world therefore the world hateth you'*** (Jn.15:19); ***'And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind...'***, (Rom.12:2); ***'Love not the world neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world,*** (1Jn.2:15,16); ***'...friendship of the world is enmity with God. Whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God'***, (James 4:4). Has the world come into the church to take the church into the world? **Terry Arnold**

In Christ

. 1John 3:1 says, '**Behold what manner of love the Father has bestowed upon us; that we should be called the sons of God...**' Jesus Christ's death for us has shown us His love, as well as made possible our becoming children of God. God did everything. We simply believe that Jesus, God's Son, died to take the punishment for our sins, and we receive Him as our Lord and Saviour. We receive this gift of eternal life with God - as His children - through faith, trusting what God had done.

As God's children our relationship is established, and nothing can separate us from the love of God, (Romans 8:35-39). God is our loving Father. He is going to protect us, provide for us, and help us to grow. We can be assured that God was not going to go to the extent of having Jesus die for us, and then leave everything up to us - for us to have to make it on our own. Rather, we are safe, secure, and provided for; we are loved.

The picture of the developing child in its mother's womb is a good illustration of each of us as a child of God. Surrounded by the sac of fluid, the child is safe from harm. Similarly we are surrounded by God's love. There is a song that says:...'Wherever I am I'll praise Him...For His love surrounds me like a sea...' (Apparently the fluid around the baby is salty too!).

The developing child is attached to its mother by the umbilical cord. We become attached to God - our relationship is established - when we repent of living our own way and turn to Jesus as our Lord and Saviour. He is the vine and we are the branches. His life begins to flow in us.

The umbilical cord has two functions - to provide nourishment and to take out waste products, things that are not of benefit to the child. Similarly, our Lord feeds us on His Word and cleanses us of sin.

Even in this fallen world the child's needs are usually met. Sometimes this means that the mother becomes deficient in some area. With God, there are no deficiencies. Philippians 4:19 says: '**And my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus**'. Romans 8:32 tells us, '**He that spared not His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things**'.

What is the baby's part? Simply to receive nourishment and to give up that which is no good. The baby does not strive and worry. There must simply be a free flow to and from the mother via the umbilical cord. So it should be with us and Jesus. Can you put yourself in the place of the developing child? Safe, secure and developing...loved! Colossians 3:3 says, '**...your life is hid with Christ in God**'.

As with the developing child, our part is to receive. For us this means believing God and accepting what He says is true. Then we will grow as His children, in His ways. We cannot afford any clogging up of things because we will not let go of all that is not of Him. Let us be happy to give them to Jesus and not hide them or defend them.

Another illustration is the Potter and the clay. It is the Potter who moulds and shapes until He completes the vessel He has designed. The clay submits itself to all the turnings, mouldings... of the Potter's hands. This speaks of our obedience to God; believing what He says, which will result in our doing, saying, and thinking the right things.

Philippians 1:6 says, '**being confident of this, that He which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ**'. We can have confidence in God's ability to shape us. Has He not shown us things in the past? Will He not show us things as we are ready to be shown? As parents we show our children things when we think they are ready for them. God knows when we are ready.

What a truly wonderful God! Let us rest in Him as the developing child does in its mother's womb. From the tiniest cell the baby grows into an incredibly complex, complete baby, ready to meet its mother face to face. So with us, we become mature '**unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ**', (Eph.4:13), ready to meet our God face to face. Our part is simply to trust God, believe Him and *surrender* ourselves to His work and to the good pleasure of His will.

Colossians 2:6,7 says: '**As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in Him. Rooted and built up in Him, and established in the faith, as ye have been taught, abounding therein with thanksgiving**'. We receive Him by faith, and we are to continue living with Him by faith. Everything in our salvation is a gift - from beginning to end. God is the giver and we are the receivers. We cannot earn this blessed life. We need only to believe God for it, receive it, and thank Him for it.

Let us rejoice and be glad. We are God's children - safe, secure and loved. God our Father is in charge. Leave the running of things to Him. We keep in touch with Him and obey Him. We are not to worry or complain, but to trust God and rest in Him. 1Thessalonians 5:16-18 reminds us: '**Rejoice evermore, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you**'. It is a real challenge to trust God and give thanks '**in everything**'. When things seem difficult to us, we think things have gone wrong, and we stop trusting God. God tells us that these things are good for us. It is part of His good work in us. Also, suffering for Jesus' sake was promised to us, (John 15:20). Paul suffered much and pointed out that these things had resulted in '**the furtherance of the Gospel**', (Phil.1:12). What victory the suffering of Jesus brought! We need to trust God in all things! He loves us and knows what is best for us, and He has the power to do all that He wants.

We often allow our feelings to be an obstacle in our lives. We must not go by feelings. We must go by God's Word. When we believe His Word and receive it, then good feelings will follow. Feelings other than joy and happiness are an indication that we need to commune with God, to check our receiving of God's ways and our letting go of what is not of Him. Once we believe God and act accordingly, including confession of wrong doings and unbelief, our joy and peace will return. (When we are not joyful, our relationship with God is not broken. God still loves us and does not desire to disconnect the umbilical cord. On the contrary, He will be clearing the obstruction. He longs for you to turn to Him, confess your failings, and believe and accept His ways. He wants the best for His children.)

Isaiah 46:4 says: '**And even to your old age I am He, and even to hoar hairs will I carry you. I have made and I will bear; even I will carry and I will deliver you**'. What assurance God's people have! Let us all be encouraged to really spend time with God - to listen, receive, and give up. And just as the developing child knows its mother's heart, we too will get to know God's loving heart. The more we know we are loved, the more we will respond in love both to God and to others.

God has not made us to be alone in His womb of love. We have many brothers and sisters. Let's be '**kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you**', (Eph.4:32), and let us come together often to praise our God. **Beth Arnold**

Editors Comments: Dear A,...You may think the accounts by various people, including Mrs. Parham, were biased, but can they be substantiated with facts, documentation, and eye witnesses? Yes, they can! The records show that Parham and Seymour were not the men that they were made out to be. Not all accounts say that Azusa St. began OK. Several accounts seriously question the beginnings. If you look closely at how it all began you find that a woman had an *unscriptural experience*! She spoke in an '*unknown tongue*' which was a counterfeit of Acts 2. Study Acts 2 and we find that it was a *known human language*, (Acts 2:9,10,11)! Similarly for Acts 10, (vs.45,46, note '*also*'), and Acts 19. These are the *only historic* cases of tongues in the Bible! This is what the students of Parham were encouraged to receive - the *same* experience as at Acts 2. However, the lady (Ozman) instead received an *unknown tongue*. No one knew what it was and no one understood it.
