Editor's Comment

In the last few years I have been perusing mission publications, tracts and other evangelistic magazines with one purpose - to see what they present as the 'Gospel'. I have been increasingly dismayed at what I have read. Some I have written to and challenged the authors to re-look at their Gospel statements. I have been surprised at some of the excuses made. Many cases could be cited but the most recent will serve as an example of what I believe is now a most serious problem. (I am not naming the publication, as dialogue is continuing and they have agreed to read and consider material sent)...

An Australian missionary organisation that trains and sends missionaries has this at the beginning of their publication under the following headings:

'Our message': 'That Christ alone is the hope of nations. That God in Christ, reconciles the world to himself. That salvation is found in no one else but Jesus. That God's immeasurable love for people everywhere meant that he gave his one and only son in death so that people might live. That there is no other name under heaven by which people must be saved. That Jesus Christ took on human flesh in order to save human beings'.

'The Gospel': 'The best news and the most important news any human being can ever hear. It is not the religious artifact of the west, the east, the north or the south. The Gospel is good news of Jesus Christ that God addresses to the entire human race. It sets forth Jesus Christ as the Saviour, Master, Life and Hope of all who put their trust in Him. Eternal destinies hinge on whether or not people hear this gospel and what they do with what they hear'.

At first glance the above might sound reasonable? But let's remember that it is the 'GOSPEL' being described here. Let's look at what is missing (my comments in **bold** and brackets) and then the mission director's reply.

'Our message': That Christ alone is the hope of nations. That God in Christ, reconciles the world to himself. [This is from 2Cor.5:19 which also continues: "...not imputing their trespasses unto them..." That salvation is found in no one else but Jesus. That God's immeasurable love for people everywhere meant that he gave his one and only son in death so that people might live. [But what was the reason? What was the 'death' for? As a religious (unsaved) person I once believed this and thought it quite 'noble'!] That there is no other name under heaven by which people must be saved. [Saved from WHAT?] That Jesus Christ took on human flesh in order to save human beings. [From what? Many today think they are doing OK and don't need 'jesus'; or they will 'tack' Him onto other 'gods' in their life?]

'The Gospel': The best news and the most important news any human being can ever hear. It is not the religious artifact of the west, the east, the north or the south. The Gospel is good news of Jesus Christ that God addresses to the entire human race. It sets forth Jesus Christ as the Saviour, Master, Life and Continued next page >

Dear sir, Hell is a Christian Hoax in the church out of the dark ages... (Pastor J.M.)

Editor's Reply: If Hell is a 'hoax' then God is a liar, the Bible is not inspired and you would need to cut the following out of your Bible: Hell is a place mentioned no less than 20 times in the NT (eg. Mk.9:45,48; Rev.20:14). Hell is called a place of 'torment' (Matt.8:12; 22:13; 25:30; Lk.16:28). It has a reason for existing (Is.66:24; Matt.25:41; Mk.9:44,46,48). And Hell is 'eternal' (Matt.25:46)...You may end up with a useless Bible full of 'holes'?

I wrote to the magazine mission director: 'There is simply no mention in either paragraph of what we are saved from and there is no mention of sin. How can one know to be saved if they do not know what they need saving from? The two paragraphs tell the reader what to be saved to quite well. But if I was an unsaved person, I might make a commitment to this but still not know what I am really saved from! When I was once a religious person I well accepted these sort of presentations and yet I was not Born Again then...I pray you will consider my plea here to better and more accurately present the Gospel?'

The reply was as follows: '...The purpose of our magazine is not to present the gospel but to encourage God's people to engage fully in the work of the gospel among unreached peoples of the world. So, our brief comments to which you refer below, are not intended to spell out the gospel in detail, but to encourage more people to participate in God's redemptive plan. Our magazine is not an evangelistic tool'.

I wrote again and stated: "...I don't see why if you have a heading 'Gospel' that it cannot be better presented? Who knows who will read this? What if I read it when I was a religious person? I see no reason why the heart of the gospel would not be there? (It is only a matter of one or two extra lines?).

The reply was short: 'Thanks brother, point well made. I appreciate your concern and commitment to the things of God!'

Whenever we print the word 'Gospel' surely we must be committed to getting it right! This is one area where we should leave no stone unturned in preciseness and in striving for perfection! The Gospel is in danger of being lost. I am openly pleading for mission organisations and elders/Pastors to re-teach the Gospel and the doctrines that undergird it. Although the Gospel must be stated simply and clearly and without unnecessary 'theology', yet we must understand the doctrines which give the words meaning, understanding and life. Then might we well state the Gospel with accuracy and also be aware of the things that *cannot* be excluded. The Gospel is 'good news', but only because of bad news! It is man's sin and his filthy rags under the judgement of God that ever made a necessity for the good news of Jesus Christ. That good news is that there is a substitute who came with a substitutionary sacrifice and through His shed blood to redeem helpless man if he will understand he is a sinner and believe Jesus has paid the perfect price that God demands. Jesus' death, burial and resurrection are all part of that salvation plan which God has deemed all sufficient to rescue man from his sin.

The Deception of 'The Other Side of Heaven'

Recently my wife and I had time away and a break from ministry. While relaxing one night we watched a DVD we had found in our church library. It was titled 'The Other Side of Heaven'. The cover said nothing about any church or organisation and was supposedly just a true story about a 'missionary' who went to the Tongan islands. I was expecting something interesting and was captivated by the pictures on the cover of a sea story and shipwreck.

Within the first few minutes the story mentioned things that seemed odd to me, one of them being the missionary, John Groberg, training in the American *Bringham Young* University. As the movie progressed I realised this was a story of a *Mormon missionary*. I could have switched it off, but knowing I had been deceived by the cover and the promo, I wanted to see enough that I could write about this. The movie was clever propaganda. It promoted the purity of motives of the Mormon missionary. (He once resists attempts to lie with a beautiful woman who is later converted). The movie did not blatantly promote Mormonism and even deceptively had the missionary reading and using *a Bible* instead of their first book, 'The Book of Mormon' (Mormonism teaches that the Bible is unreliable). As the movie progressed, the missionary tells a dying man to go to the 'light' - this sounded more occult than Christian. In another scene the missionary raises a dead boy after 24 hours of prayer and reciting a strange mantra 'good air in, bad air out'. The boy revives and many locals believe the Mormon faith. (The Mormon faith claims many miracles and healings).

The gospel promoted in the film was a subtle mix of morals and works. There was already a Protestant missionary on the island who warns the people not to follow this 'false gospel'. But the people see the missionary's 'good' life of 'holiness' and think therefore that his gospel must be true. In the end he appears to even win the respect of the Protestant missionary.

Satan, as 'an angel of light' (2Cor.11:4) is skilled at lying and deceit. The founder of Mormonism, Joseph Smith, had an encounter with a divine 'light' which fell on his head and seized his tongue. Two beings spoke and told him to teach another 'restored' gospel of jesus and that all other religions were wrong. Christian friends warned Smith that this was a counterfeit vision. This 'restored gospel' in the 'inspired' Book of Mormon was supposedly translated by Joseph Smith from 'golden plates' hidden by an angel. (Yet this book has chronological, geographical and theological contradictions and errors - see our booklet 'Errors of Mormonism' which also details Joseph Smith's false prophecies).

The Mormon 'jesus' is a created being; was born in Jerusalem (not Bethlehem); had to be exalted to Godhood; was conceived by sex between Mary and God the Father (who lives on a planet called Kolob); is the spirit brother of Satan; and was a polygamist. Together with Joseph Smith this 'jesus' supposedly can 'save' us.

All this is hidden in the appealing beauty of the trials of a young 'missionary' to Tonga!

Sydney Parish Bonnyrigg (15,127 Catholics) **373 abused** (240 boys; 134 girls). Queensland, Brisbane, Parish Browns Plains (14,501 Catholics) **358 abused** (230 boys; 128 girls).

Queensland, Brisbane, Parish Burleigh Heads (28,061 Catholics) **693 abused** (445 boys; 248 girls).

Queensland, Brisbane, Parish Maroochydore (19,312 Catholics) **477 abused** (306 boys; 171 girls).

Queensland, Diocese Rockhampton; Parish Bundaberg (14,025 Catholics) **346 abused** (222 boys; 124 girls).

South Australia, Adelaide, Parish Salisbury (17,213 Catholics) **425 abused** (273 boys; 152 girls).

In the U.S. and Canada approximately 1.7% of females and 3.3% of males had been sexually abused in childhood by a priest. The suicide rate is also horrifying (20% of victims are at 'high risk').

Mormonism as a 'Cult' Removed From Billy Graham Website



An article describing Mormonism as a 'cult' was removed from the *Billy Graham Evangelistic Association's* (*BGEA*) website following Republican presidential candidate [Mormon] Mitt Romney's visit with Graham.

The article described The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints [Mormons]...as a group that 'teaches

doctrines or beliefs that deviate from the biblical message of the Christian faith'...The article was removed sometime after Romney, a Mormon, visited Graham at his Montreat, N.C., home. Ken Barun, chief of staff for BGEA, said...'Our primary focus at the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association has always been promoting the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We removed the information from the website because we do not wish to participate in a theological debate about something that has become politicised during this campaign'...

...The 93-year-old Graham said he was honoured to have met the candidate, with whom he had the opportunity to pray. 'What impresses me even more than Gov. Romney's successful career are his values and strong moral convictions', said Graham...

Franklin Graham, Billy Graham's son and the president and CEO of the BGEA, told The Christian Broadcasting Network in December 2011 that Romney's Mormon faith 'doesn't bother me at all'...He was also asked in an interview with MSNBC in February if he considers Romney a Christian. 'Most Christians would not recognise Mormonism as part of the Christian faith...Now, of course they believe in Jesus Christ, but they have a lot of other things that they believe in too that we don't accept theologically' he said.

Editors Comment: Ecumenism is laced with so called 'non confrontation' in doctrine and the Gospel. 'Theological debate' is frowned upon. BGEA 'promoting the gospel of Jesus Christ' is admirable, but warning people of cults is also a command in the word of God! And if the focus of BGEA is 'promoting the gospel' only, then why mention Mormonism on the website in the first place and why remove it because of a visit by any Mormon? Is it OK for them to read it but if they visit in person we 'remove' it? Is there not hypocrisy in this? How can it be that we can confess something true about Mormonism in a website and then remove it when a Mormon comes to 'visit'? Jesus spoke of those not willing to profess openly 'because they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God' (Jn.12:42,43).

Mormons do often have 'values and strong moral convictions', but does that get one into the kingdom of Heaven? And why does it not 'bother' the BGEA that anyone is a Mormon? Does it not bother us if anyone is unsaved? The ecumenical movement is full of hypocrisies which dilute the Gospel.

Hello Terry, I am really enjoying reading 'Calvinism & Arminianism - out of the Maze' - the history most of which was unknown to me. Most Christians would not be conversant with this information. Many display Arminian traits when quoting 2Peter 3:9...I downloaded the NT Commentary by Wiersbie. concerning 2Pet.3:9 - it says: 'If God is long-suffering toward lost sinners, why did Peter write, 'The Lord...is long-suffering to us-ward'? Who is meant by 'us-ward'? It would appear that God is long-suffering to His own people! Perhaps Peter was using the word 'us' in a general way, meaning 'mankind'. But it is more likely that he was referring to his readers as the elect of God (1Pet.1:2; 2Pet.1:10). God is long-suffering toward lost sinners because some of them will believe and become a part of God's elect people. We do not know who God's elect are among the unsaved people of the world, nor are we supposed to know. Our task is to make our own 'calling and election sure' (2Pet.1:10; cf. Lk.13:23-30). The fact that God has His elect people is an encouragement to us to share the Good News and seek to win others to Christ'. [Wiersbie]

The Issue

From time to time I hear and read of preachers and writers admonishing their listeners to have the 'correct' name of our Lord and Saviour. There is wrangling over what words we should use for the name of the one who died on a cross and bore our sins. In some circles there has been an increasing emphasis when writing the name of Jesus or God to use Hebrew forms of God's name such as Yeshua or Yashua, YHWH, etc.

The English speaking world calls Him 'Jesus', an Anglicization of the Greek 'Iησούς' (pronounced 'yesous'), itself believed to be a transliteration of the Hebrew Yeshu'a, meaning 'YHWH is salvation'. Iησούς means Saviour (Matt.1:1,16,21). He is commonly referred to as Jesus Christ, where 'Christ' is a title derived from the Greek Χριστός, (pronounced 'Christos') meaning 'Anointed One', which corresponds to the Hebrew-derived 'Messiah'. Thus some prefer the title 'Jeshua Ha Maschiach'.

The Root

Confused? That's what many have become, due to those who could well be called 'judaisers' who wrangle over what name we should be using. Recent Judaistic movements, including what some refer to as the 'Hebrew Roots Movement', rely heavily on finding Jewish meanings and equivalents.

The warning signs of these extremes are often evident when people become very interested in Old Testament feast days and keeping and practising them; obsessive interest in Jewish ways, customs and lifestyles; and studying and reading from Jewish Bibles with Hebrew names inserted. These *preferences* may not be error in and of themselves (and we are not expressing any form of anti-Semitism here), but it is the obsessiveness with which it is often held that can destroy the unity of a local body of believers.

In some publications and Bibles, Hebrew titles for God are now inserted into the New Testament text. Instead of Jesus, the 'original Hebrew name' of 'Y'shua' is used. At the root of this error is the denial of this fact: God inspired the writers to put the New Testament Scriptures down in *Koine Greek*. It is these original *Greek* manuscripts which are *inspired* and *inerrant*.

The Greek for Jesus is $\mathbf{I} \boldsymbol{\eta} \boldsymbol{\sigma} \boldsymbol{o} \boldsymbol{\acute{v}} \boldsymbol{\varsigma}$ (pronounced Yesous). Although it is said that $\mathbf{I} \boldsymbol{\eta} \boldsymbol{\sigma} \boldsymbol{o} \boldsymbol{\acute{v}} \boldsymbol{\varsigma}$ is a transliteration of the Hebrew Y'shua, nevertheless God *ordained* it to be written as the *Greek* $\mathbf{I} \boldsymbol{\eta} \boldsymbol{\sigma} \boldsymbol{o} \boldsymbol{\acute{v}} \boldsymbol{\varsigma}$! That word was translated into English Bibles as 'Jesus'. Who will dare say that the original Greek is in error when 'holy men of God were moved by the Holy Ghost' to pen the words (2Pet.1:21)? Does not the Lord know who we are talking about when we say 'Jesus'? Why the necessity for a Hebrew name when the inspired and infallible New Testament was written in Greek and that Greek has ' $\mathbf{I} \boldsymbol{\eta} \boldsymbol{\sigma} \boldsymbol{o} \boldsymbol{\acute{v}} \boldsymbol{\varsigma}$ ', translated into almost all Bibles as 'Jesus'? Did God *fail* to preserve His name in the copies and early translations?

Many scholars and language experts believe that Jesus and the apostles probably spoke Aramaic in every day language, but all spoke and wrote in Koine Greek, the 'common' ('koine') language of the day. It was this Greek language that God ordained to have the New Testament Word of God written in. So, why confuse people with 'Yeshua' or other Hebrew names when everyone knows Him as 'Jesus'? And why don't we be more 'accurate' and use $I \eta \sigma o \dot{\upsilon} \varsigma$ and pronounce it correctly as 'yesous'? Do we need to have classes to teach people how to pronounce this? I am confident that whatever name I use the Lord knows the thoughts before they come off my tongue (Ps.139:4,23). He also knows which ' $I \eta \sigma o \dot{\upsilon} \varsigma$ ' I speak of by doctrine. The $I \eta \sigma o \dot{\upsilon} \varsigma$ or 'Jesus' I speak of is the one born in Bethlehem, who claimed to be the creator of the Heavens and the earth, the only begotten son of God who died on a cross at Calvary to atone for men's sins and to receive those who would believe in Him.

This scramble to find the Lord's correct name has led to a labyrinth of opinions and pronunciations, but at the root of it is Judaism and Gnosticism! The Devil loves to drive people to extremes! Whether we call him Jesus or some other Hebrew name, we know, and He knows, just who we refer to!

For centuries the English speaking Church has used the term 'The Lord Jesus Christ' and translated that into numerous languages around the world. The name of any person will vary depending on where the person is born. A person called 'Michael' in England could be Mike, (North America), Michel (France), Mihael (Ireland) or Mikhail (USSR)...but it is still the *same person* being referred to.

People who would get hung up on Hebrew names for the Messiah should consider other names in the Bible. How would they pronounce the Hebrew for the Archangel 'Michael' from the book of Daniel?

'Fables', 'questions' and 'jangling'...

Scripture warns of Judaisers and those who would come in and confuse the brethren. The Bible mentions 'fables', including 'Jewish fables': 'For there are many unruly and vain talkers and deceivers, especially they of the circumcision...rebuke them sharply, that they may be sound in the faith; Not giving heed to Jewish fables, and commandments of men, that turn from the truth...' (Tit.1:10-16). The word 'fables' refers to a tale or that which is fabricated by the mind in contrast to reality. It is the word from which 'mythology' is derived. Such 'fables' are falsehoods and pretences. In 2 Peter 1:16 they are described as 'cunningly devised' for the purpose of deceiving others. We are warned of Judaism just as Paul warned Timothy! (The danger is that many Jewish Christian assemblies have ended up more judaistic than of Jesus).

Christians need not get caught up in 'foolish questions' and contentions about the law (Tit.3:9). The fruit of such 'minister questions, rather than godly edifying' and those who engaged in such have 'turned aside unto vain jangling; desiring to be teachers of the law; understanding neither what they say, nor whereof they affirm' (1Tim.1:3-7).

Editor's Reply: You are correct. Originally when I researched this story many years ago I felt there was sufficient circumstantial evidence in the following: The fact that the account was on James Bartley's tombstone; that the 'British admiralty' supposedly testified of the account; that at the time there were several newspaper articles mentioning the story; and that there was a ship 'Star of the East' in the Faulkland Islands at that time.

However, many media accounts at the same time wrote of a different ship which had chased a whale and beached it ashore in England. That whale was cut open for all to see. This story featured in the news at the same time as the James Bartley story is supposed to have occurred. Many believe that the Bartley story arose out of this event.

I did some more research and it does appear that some of the accounts in the media of the day of this are confused and mixed. My main point was to prove that scientists once considered it impossible for a whale to swallow a human. Yet Sperm whales are capable of swallowing humans. Some live on squid, which they swallow whole. In 1955 a 405 pound squid was removed intact from the belly of a sperm whale.

But the James Bartley story, with the research I have done since the article, lacks evidence and accounts are sketchy and it could be, as you say, that there is 'almost no evidence'. I will not be using this story again unless I get solid evidence of its veracity. We certainly do not need this story to prove anything in the Bible. Thanks for prompting me to look at this again.

A more serious concern...example: Don Stanton

Don Stanton of 'Maranatha' has written many sound articles and has put forward many challenging ideas in the area of prophecy. However, in recent times there have been several writers who have raised alarm at his increasing emphasis on bringing Christians back under the Law. But it is his teaching on the 'name of the Messiah' and a new Bible version that we are concerned with in this article. In his endtime news booklet Don states he is using a new version called 'Clear Preferred Version' (CPV) and instead of Jesus, the 'original Hebrew name of 'Y'shua' is used. But do we not get our New Testament translations from the original Koine Greek, and not from any Hebrew text? Most who would 'correct' the name of Jesus do not believe the original texts were written in the common (Koine) Greek language. They look to a mythical 'Hebrew' original. The question to ask such people is: 'Do you believe in the inspiration, inerrancy of the original Greek texts?'

On Stanton's website there is much written about why we should change the name of 'Jesus'. Below we have copied parts of this with our comments in **bold** and brackets.

'Some will say, 'Jesus' is an English translation of 'Y'shua'. To which I reply, 'Why did His Name ever need to be translated?' You are most welcome to explain the meaning of the Name by way of translation, (Yahweh is salvation), but the Saviour's original, authentic Name must not be eliminated!...'

[The original name in the Greek text, despite whether it is a 'transliteration' or not, <u>was written</u> as <u>inspired Greek</u> and that Greek is $I \eta \sigma o \dot{v} \varsigma$ (pronounced yesous)]

'But actually, 'Jesus' is not a translation. It is a transliteration of 'Y'shua' A transliteration is the carrying of a word over into another language so that it sounds very much the same as in the original, even though written in a different alphabet. The Name Y'shua should have been transliterated into all languages exactly, or very closely to the way it sounds in the original. Some transliterations are close, but some, as in English, sounds far removed from the original...'

[Again, this is still avoiding the fact that the writers wrote 'the original' in Greek and they were inspired to do this]

'Yes, Y'shua and Jesus are really the same name, but I'm sure you will agree that Jesus doesn't sound anything like Y'shua...'

[This statement lacks understanding of Greek and the 'translation' process. English rarely sounds the same as Greek and it is not meant to. The inspired originals for the New Testament are NOT Hebrew but Koine Greek. This is dangerous territory because it is a rejection of the idea that the originals are *Greek* and that *they are inspired!*]

'The reason is because 'Jesus' is a poor transliteration - both in spelling and pronunciation. And the reason for that faulty transliteration is because the Name has come into English, not directly from the Hebrew, but through Greek and Roman, and because of English language 'mutation'...Y'shua was brought

over from Hebrew into Greek as Iesous'.

[Regardless of whether 'Jesus' is a 'poor translation', it has come from inspired originals and those originals were written in Koine GREEK! Stanton consistently brushes over this point to get to a mythical Hebrew text. There are NO inspired Hebrew 'originals' for the NT. The manuscripts were in Koine Greek and the name $I\eta\sigma\sigma\acute{o}\acute{o}\varsigma$ (not Y'shua) is written in the copies of them]

'The reason for that mutation is because the Greeks have a lazy tongue and do not pronounce ye and shu...'

[On the contrary, Koine Greek was an exacting language. It sometimes has as many as five words for our one English word. Its delineation of tenses enables precision. It is *the language* that *God chose* to use in His originals which are *inspired* and *inerrant*]

'For the Greek it is much easier to pronounce the letters as 'ee' and 'soo'. So Yeshua mutated to Iesous...'

['Mutated'? Did God not know what He was doing when He 'moved' men to write down the scriptures and write I $\eta \sigma \circ \iota \varsigma$ for 'Jesus' (2Pet.1:20,21)?]

'I know some people today who love the Name of Y'shua, but they pronounce it as Ishua. They can't clearly hear the difference. Iesous became Iesus in Roman (Latin), and it then became Yesus in English...'

[This is a 'strawman'. The inspired Greek is $I \eta \sigma o \psi \varsigma$ and it is pronounced like 'yesous' or 'yairsous'. Forget the Latin - the Greek ' $I \eta \sigma o \psi \varsigma$ ' is pronounced when transliterated from Greek to English as 'yesous']

'In the 16th century, Yesus became Jesus when J was added to the English alphabet. In other tongues also, the Name has been brought over from a variety of language Bibles, including Greek, Latin and English, without much consideration of the original Hebrew...'

[What 'original Hebrew'? Again, the original inspired authors wrote the New Testament in Greek]

'But someone will say 'Jesus is the Name in the inspired Greek New Testament'. That's not quite right. The word in the Greek NT is IESOUS. So if we used the Greek name, then we should call the Saviour, Iesous. Why should we call Him Jesus, Yesu, Isu, etc., if Iesous was the most correct form?...'

[The simple answer is that 'Jesus' is the recognised <u>English</u> translation of the Greek I $\eta \sigma \circ \circ \varsigma$. Don has not recognised the fact that most people do not read Greek! But if Don wants to keep the original (Greek) name then why does he use a Hebrew name Y'shua instead of the Greek I $\eta \sigma \circ \circ \varsigma$?]

'For many years I thought that 'Jesus' was a Hebrew word - the actual name spoken by the apostles. It came as a jolt to realise that the disciples never heard the pronunciation, 'Jesus'. Nor did the Greeks!...'

[Of course they never heard the name 'Jesus' - because they mostly spoke and wrote in Aramaic and Greek, not English!]

'Y'shua was neither an Englishman, nor a Greek! He was a Hebrew!

Why did the apostles write in Greek? Paul and John wrote in Greek because the Great Commission was to preach the Gospel to the uttermost parts of the earth. And Greek was the main international language through which it could be accomplished at that time...'

[Correct. This appears to contradict the idea of any Hebrew originals? But it must also be said here that this Greek New Testament was *inspired*]

'Why did they use the word Iesous instead of Y'shua? In writing in Greek, the New Testament apostles used the Greek form of the Name of Y'shua, Iesous, as that Name had already mutated, orally, from the Hebrew, and was in general usage...The exact letters Paul used we do not know, as the original manuscripts are not available, and the earliest Greek scripts available are copies made in the 3rd century and thereafter...it is possible that the Greek spelling or pronunciation of the Saviour's Name changed from the form that Paul and John used, especially as the church soon became predominantly gentile...'

[If the apostles used a 'Greek form' of the Hebrew name of Y'shua, then that 'Greek form' is still *inspired*! The issue here is *inspiration* and *preservation*! Our copies are faithful to the originals (see our article *Diakrisis* Nov/Dec/2012). Don here appears to cast doubt as to the inspiration and preservation of the texts]

'In translating from the Greek and Latin into English, the early translators had three options. 1. To use the spelling Iesous. 2. To use an English form that had developed orally via Latin, even though it was further from the original. 3. To return to the original language from where the Name came, and use that original Name - Y'shua or Yeshua. They chose the middle course. [They] could have [gone]...back to the Hebrew...But they didn't...'

[Any previous Latin copies were *not* considered inspired. The KJV translators translated the NT from the Greek (there was no 'Hebrew'). That Greek had I $\eta \sigma o \dot{\upsilon} \varsigma$; and that Greek they considered *inspired*]

Why is this important?

Many might read this article and conclude it is unprofitable argumentation. Yet this subject has become a matter of contention in many assemblies today. We agree it is a diversion from more important things such as the Gospel.

But at the root of this debate over the name of the Messiah is yet another subtle attack on the inspiration, inerrancy and preservation of the original New Testament Greek texts. If errors have been made in the originals with the name of the Messiah and in the copying thereof, then we do not have the inspired, inerrant and preserved word of God! That notion alone is destructive to faith. We must receive every word as from Him and not judge it, but be judged by it (Jn.12:48).
