Guest Editorial

Much of what passes for Christianity today is a tragi-comedy of cosmic proportions. The so-called Church of Jesus Christ globally is in moral free-fall and immersed in gross disobedience.

We now witness an Ecumenical milieu of deep apostasy; homosexuals and lesbians in pulpits and leadership, bishops urging a 'rethink' of foundational biblical doctrines, a rush to Rome by supposed Protestant denominations, large rallies held to 'unite' the brethren, 350,000 Evangelicals marching in the world's 'Largest Ecumenical Christian Event', some 100 pastors, deacons and church leaders revealing they are 'Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans, Questioning, and Intersex', Pentecostal conferences featuring near naked cowboys, flappers and cabaret - the list of blasphemous atrocities is endless.

Such declension can largely be sheeted home to the presentation of a false 'gospel' - one in which salvation is apparently achieved by decisional regeneration - with no repentance required - leading to a much improved and prosperous life here on earth. Filling pews with rank unbelievers who will believe anything they are taught by so-called 'leaders'.

Very few people calling themselves 'Christian' today have a clue what they have possibly been saved from or why regeneration is necessary at all. The focus of most sermons today is no longer the predicament of the sinner in the presence of God.

Mention is rarely, if ever, made of how dreadfully such a person is in danger of plunging to eternal agony - no attempt is made to present the true condition of fallen man and their precarious position in the world and the urgent need for the salvific work of Christ.

The days are long gone when the reality of hell was spelled out to trembling unbelievers. No longer are men and women made to feel the real nature and danger of sin. No call is made for them to open their eyes and see their perilous state as they stand uncovered before their creator.

Once, the truth of Hell fire awaiting the rebellious was the tool used to persuade men of their uncertain circumstance. Today that subject is ignored in an effort not to offend the tender sensibilities of a 'politically correct' generation. The fear of a terrible judgement to come is not mentioned. The vengeance of God on the wicked and unbelieving left unsaid.

It is currently taught that mankind is loved generally by God, that He sees them as easily redeemable no matter how their lives have been conducted. Today, apparently, everyone who lives a relatively decent and law-abiding life is welcomed into heavenly places at death.

And yet this is not so. The Psalmist writes; 'Surely you did set them in slippery places; you cast them down into destruction; How they are brought into desolation in a moment! They are utterly consumed with terrors'. This is eternity in correct perspective.

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There is no lack of power in God to cast the wicked into Hell at any moment. Men's hands cannot be strong when God rises up. The strongest have no ability to resist Him nor can anyone deliver them out of His hands. When it pleases God He casts His enemies down to Hell. And they deserve this so that divine justice never stands in the way. It makes no objection against God using His power at any moment to destroy the unrepentant. On the contrary, divine justice calls loudly for an infinite punishment for their sin.

What people are not taught today is that upon death Satan stands ready to fall upon them, and claim them as his own at the very moment God shall permit it. Hell opens its mouth wide to receive them. So few today realise this as they unknowingly dangle by a thread above the gaping mouth of Hades.

There is no security to be found in the fact that there are no visible means of death at hand. That immediate good health and prosperity is enjoyed, no evidence of any accident that might bring about sudden death. That there is no visible danger present that would bring about an early exit from this world.

To be unaware of this is to be found living a life of happy abandonment to the sinful pleasures offered by the world. Yet, all of the wicked plans to escape Hell, while they appear to offer salvation without Christ, do not secure them from Hell for a moment.

God is under no obligation or promise to keep any of the unbelieving out of Hell. He is dreadfully provoked, incensed and enraged over the terrible evil being practised everywhere in these last days. This is what must be preached; the awful, disastrous condition that lies ahead for anyone rejecting the salvation available through Christ alone.

To bring people into the Church with an offer of entertainment, prosperity, acceptance of their aberrant lifestyles, and 'inclusion' is to cement their damnation. If this is to become their understanding of the Christian gospel, no matter how wonderful it makes them feel, at death they will discover to their horror that they have been dreadfully deceived.

As we plunge headlong into the very last moments before the return of Christ the great falling away spoken of by the Apostle Paul is well advanced. Christian luminaries of this day seem blissfully unaware that by their unbiblical teachings millions are being led into a Christless eternity. Not just annihilation as many suppose, but an infinite eternal existence. One which offers nothing but anguish, regret, pain and torment. An experience that will lead to wishing that death would come - and it will not.

These words are written from a position of great alarm over what is occurring in the church worldwide. If these truths were preached the church would no doubt be much smaller – relatively few are finally saved – yet at least the members would be sound in doctrine, thankful to God for His mercy, and ready to present the authentic gospel to those that are perishing?

That is the utterance of their mouths, conforming with the unbelievers before them. God assail them! How they are perverted' (Sura 9:30); '... Christians call Christ the son of

Allah...Allah's curse be on them...' (Quran 9:30); 'They say: "God has begotten a son" God forbid!" (Sura 10:68); and his crucifixion: 'The Jews say, 'we slew the Messiah, Jesus son of Mary, the Messenger of God' - yet they did not slay him, neither crucified him' (Sura 4:156-157)'; and the Trinity: 'Indeed, they who disbelieved among the People of the Scripture and the polytheists will be in the fire of Hell, abiding eternally therein. Those are the most vile of created beings' (Quran 98:6).



Islam is decidedly unfriendly toward Christians: 'Believers (Muslims), take neither Jews nor Christians to be your friends: they are friends with one another. Whoever of you seeks their friendship shall become one of their number, and God does not guide (those Jewish and Christian) wrong-doers' (Quran, Sura 5:51).

What does the Bible teach on this 'merging of Christianity and Islam'?: 'Be you not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship has righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion has light with darkness? And what concord has Christ with Belial? or what part has he that believes with an unbeliever?' (2Cor.6:15,16)

'Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world' (1Jn.4:1).

The Hypocrisy Files

Atheists are fond of quoting the Bible to show passages that appear to show that God is unfair, unjust, unethical - eg. Ps.137:9 'Happy shall he be, that takes and dashes your little ones against the stones'.

The Catholic Church Teaches

(In the 'Catechism of Catholic Church'; and 'Teachings of the Catholic Church')

The Catholic Church is necessary for salvation

Justification is a *transformation* of the soul. Original sin is removed; sanctifying grace *infused*

Initial justification is by baptism

Adults prepare for justification through faith and good works

Justification is furthered by sacraments and good works; sacraments necessary for salvation and 'continual grace'

Justification is lost through mortal sin

Catholics with mortal sin are justified again through the sacrament of penance

The Bible Teaches

Sins confessed to God alone; He alone forgives sin (Mk.2:5-11; 1Jn.1:9).

Celibacy of priesthood commanded

Celibacy is permissible but *not a command*. Many apostles were married (1Cor.9:5; 1Tim.3:2, Matt.8:14)

At 'Mass' Christ is Sacrificed again.

The Illogic of Doctrine (and a Critique of Dave Hunt's 'logic')

The problem of logic

Not all the Bible would be logical to our human way of thinking. This is especially considering that our thinking is fallen through the sin of Adam and Eve. God's thinking and ways are far above our human logic. 'For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts' (Is.55:8,9).

The laws of logic are various, but even these have been devised and categorised by man and are sometimes even contradictory. There is the law of non contradiction - if a woman is pregnant then she cannot be not pregnant. However, two other laws contradict this - the law of identity and the Law of excluded middle. The Law of identity says that an idea is what it claims to be. If a woman claims to be pregnant then she is what she claims to be. The 'excluded middle' excludes a choice for a middle view between two views. The pregnant woman cannot be both pregnant and not pregnant at the same time.

The truths of sovereign election and the responsibility of man are two truths in scripture. Many attempt to reconcile these with logic that demands a third option. Many people want this third choice by logic, if not satisfied with two options or truths. They fail to see the impossibility of a 'middle' option.

The logic of non contradiction plays out in the area of the sovereignty of God in such things as election and predestination. Election cannot be of man's choice and God's choice unless one part gives the other the choice to make. Election and predestination are consistently held to be 'before the foundation of the world'. 'According as he has chosen us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love: Having predestinated us unto the adoption of children by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will' (Eph.1:4,5); '...God has from the beginning chosen you to salvation through sanctification of the Spirit and belief of the truth' (2Thess.2:13).

Put simply, a logic of *both* God choosing and man choosing is not a third option that is shown in scripture. There can be no inconsistency in what God says. He does not lie, His word is true. If it appears impossible, illogical or unfair, then it is *our* fallen logic and thinking that is in error.

Most of the great Confessions down the running centuries made mention of the secret counsel and will of God and that it was beyond man to fully comprehend the sovereignty of God in this area. The London Baptist Confession of Faith which followed the Westminster, in 1689 stated: 'Before the world was made, God's eternal, immutable purpose, which originated in the secret counsel and good pleasure of his will, moved him to choose (or to elect), in

Christ, certain of mankind to everlasting glory. Out of his mere free grace and love he predestined these chosen ones to life, although there was nothing in them to cause Him to choose them.'

Indeed the scriptures echo this sentiment: 'The secret things belong unto the Lord our God...' (Deut.29:29).

The problem with much modern teaching on election and predestination is that man attempts to reconcile the antinomy of the responsibility of man with the sovereign election of God and bring in an impossible middle third option which ends up contradicting the two major truths.

Dave Hunt's logic

It is unpalatable for us to expose such authors as Dave Hunt if it were not so serious an issue. However, the Doctrines of Grace as they have been taught by most church leaders, evangelists and revivalists over many centuries need to be defended. Hence we in this ministry take this issue seriously because it is about God's grace and His salvation. It is enough also for us to expose teaching that we believe affects evangelism and the doctrine of salvation.

Examples of faulty logic are now increasingly commonplace in doctrines that espouse the Pelagian and Arminian heresies of earlier centuries. A classic example of this was seen in the 'Berean Call', November, 2014. The author, the late Dave Hunt, in this issue argued from a logical point of view against the historical and scriptural 'Doctrines of Grace' which includes the sovereign election and predestination of God's people by God. *

In an article 'Irreconcilable Differences?' he states: 'The apparent tension between God's sovereignty and man's free will has been a point of study and discussion...'. Hunt sets the stage here with confused terms. The 'tension' is not with 'free will' but rather the 'responsibility of man' to repent. 'Free will' is not the same thing. Hunt then goes on to show his utter lack of scholarship when he objects to a statement by James M. Gray, a past president of Moody Bible Institute, who 'suggested that 'no one finite mind could hold God's...sovereignty and man's free agency..." Again, Hunt does not understand the terms. 'Free agency' is NOT Hunt's 'free will'. 'Free agency' was a term used to express man has a will that is free but only according to his nature. The scriptures consistently state that man's will is fallen and enslaved to a sinful nature in this body on earth. We were in our unsaved state 'in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were BY NATURE the children of wrath, even as others... Even when we were dead in sins, has quickened us...' (Eph.2:3-6). The 'free agency' quoted by Hunt here is vastly different to

Hunt's 'free will' - which has *no restraints*. Hunt simply did not understand the difference in terms. 'Free agency' was a common term used by many of the Divines, including Spurgeon, but they did *not* mean by this 'free will'.*

Hunt then continues: 'Unfortunately, neither John Calvin nor many of his followers today have been willing to accept both sides of this biblical teaching. The result has been devastating in its consequences for the gospel: that man can only reject Christ; he cannot accept and believe in Him unless he is sovereignly regenerated by God'.

The litany of errors here is staggering. 'Calvin and many of his followers' actually did accept 'both sides of this biblical teaching' but they expressed it in different terms and with an understanding that Hunt did not comprehend. But there is in Hunt's statement here also a sheer outright denial of scripture on the inability of unsaved man. Hunt denies that 'man can only reject Christ; he cannot accept and believe in Him unless he is sovereignly regenerated by God'. Yet scripture is replete with this very understanding! 'There is none righteous, no, not one. There is none that understands, there is none that seeks after God. They are all gone out of the way, they are together become unprofitable; there is none that does good, no, not one' (Rom.3:11,12); 'Because the carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be' (Rom.8:7,8); 'And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, has he quickened [made alive] together with him, having forgiven you all trespasses' (Col.2:13). Why does Hunt think that this unsaved man can 'accept and believe' in and of himself when he is of the 'not one' who can 'do good', 'neither indeed can be' subject to God's law, and is 'dead in sins' and has to be 'made alive' - the very 'regeneration' necessary that Hunt denies! What ability is their in unsaved man when 'the natural man receives not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned' (1Cor.2:14)? The Scriptures teach that in our unsaved state our 'understanding was darkened' and we were 'alienated from the life of God...because of the blindness of our hearts' (Eph.4:18). What does Hunt not understand about the need for 'sovereign regeneration' when Jesus said 'No man can come to me, except the Father which has sent me draw him: and I will raise him up at the last day...And he said, Therefore said I unto you, that no man can come unto me, except it were given unto him of my Father' (Jn.6:44,65)?

Why does Hunt give unsaved man a power and ability he does not have according to scripture? And how has this belief that unsaved man 'can only reject Christ...unless he is sovereignly regenerated' been 'devastating in its consequences for the Gospel'? On the contrary, it rather impresses more the need for the Gospel to be given to the unsaved so the Spirit might 'draw' and save! This was the driving force for the Awakenings, revivals and missions of old!

Hunt continues: 'Calvinism refuses to accept what so many great evangelists have recognized is vital'. This statement is actually a blatant contradiction of history! Almost all of the great revivalists and evangelists believed in the sovereign regeneration, unconditional election and the predestination that Hunt denies. Even by Hunt's standards they would have all been called 'Calvinists' today. The most famous missionaries would have been in his sights: such men as John Eliot (1604-1690), David Brainerd (1718-1747) and William Carey (1761-1834) - considered 'the father of modern missions' who helped found the Baptist Missionary Society in 1792. Others would have been Adoniram Judson and David Livingstone (1813-73). Then there are the Puritans and the founders of churches such as Darby and Mueller (Brethren founders); the great revivals and Awakenings under Jonathan Edwards, George Whitefield and Spurgeon; not to mention most of the commentators such as Matthew Henry, and then the translators of the KJV Bible and many of the great hymn writers...the list would be exhaustive who would utterly refute Hunt's logic by their own teachings.

...Hunt continues with his own extended logic in a quote of agreement from another author: 'Some have looked at God's choice alone and ignored the means and the necessary choice on man's part'. The problem with this statement is that Scripture has God choosing us, not man choosing God (Eph.1:4,5; 2Thess.2:13; Lk.19:10; Mk.13:20; Matt.20:16; Acts 9:15; 22:14; Rom.16:13; Rev.17:14). Not one single scripture has man choosing God for salvation. Any 'choice' we have made would first necessitate an action of God's Spirit on our unsaved minds - 'in whom the god of this world has blinded the minds of them which believe not...' (2Cor.4:4).

Hunt then produces a common strawman: '...would a Holy God decree the evil that fills man's heart and the world today? Surely not!' However, most of the 'Calvinists' in history have not, and do not, teach this 'decree', but rather that God simply foreknew and allowed the fall of Adam and Eve.

The strawmen continue: 'Calvinism denies to man any real choice concerning anything he thinks or does. C. H. Spurgeon referred to 'a class of strong-minded hard-headed men who magnify sovereignty at the expense of [human] responsibility'. However, historic 'Calvinism' did not deny choices made by men 'concerning anything he thinks and does'. Spurgeon also refers here to hyper-Calvinism where sovereign election (involving what some call 'double predestination') overrode the truth of the responsibility of man. The truth is that Spurgeon, as did almost all the great evangelists, revivalists and reformers, believed in both sovereign unconditional election and the responsibility of man. Hunt was well known for confusing historic teaching on sovereign election with a hyper-Calvinism, even after being shown his error in this by many.

Hunt completely denies the inability (depravity) of unsaved man as a 'slave to sin' (Jn.8:34; Rom.6:17-20). He says: 'Are all people free to put their trust in the Lord Jesus Christ as personal Saviour for their sin? Yes'. But this contradicts much scripture which has unsaved man as a 'slave to sin', unable to

keep God's laws (Rom.8:7,8; 1Cor.2:14), his mind blinded (2Cor.4:4) and his heart wicked (Jer.17:9) and this *by nature* (Eph.2:3). The inability in unsaved man is obvious in scripture, apart from the Holy Spirit setting man free.

If the unsaved are completely 'free' to accept and believe in Jesus then why 'the natural man receives not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned' (1Cor.2:14); 'the carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be' (Rom.8:7,8).

If unsaved man is completely 'free' to accept and believe in Jesus then why did Jesus say 'No man can come to me, except the Father which has sent me draw him...' (Jn.6:44)?

If unsaved man is completely 'free' to accept and believe in Jesus then why is it that 'there is none that seeks after God' (Rom.3:11)? Why is it that it is always God seeking and choosing man and not man seeking or choosing God? 'For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost' (Lk.19:10); 'According as he has chosen us in him before the foundation of the world...' (Eph.1:4).

If unsaved man is completely 'free' to accept and believe in Jesus then why is it that 'the god of this world has <u>blinded the minds</u> of them which believe not...' (2Cor.4:4).

If unsaved man is completely 'free' to accept and believe in Jesus then why does God need to 'free' us? 'If the Son therefore shall make you free, you shall be free indeed' (Jn.8:36). If unsaved man is completely 'free' then why does the Son need to set us 'free'? What do we need to be 'free' from?

Hunt actually denies there is any scripture for man only being free to act according to his nature. He rejects another author who states: 'I believe in free will; but then it is a will only free to act according to nature.... The sinner in his sinful nature could never have a will according to God. For this he must be born again'. To this Hunt says: 'Nowhere does the Bible support such a statement'. Yet the Bible is clear on this very statement in that unsaved man was: 'in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were BY NATURE the children of wrath, even as others... Even when we were dead in sins, has quickened us...' (Eph.2:3-6). The same doctrine is repeated in others scriptures where unsaved man is said to be 'dead in sins' (Eph.2:1,5; Col.2:13). Not once does Hunt give any scripture for his view that unsaved man is totally free in his nature to not be a 'slave to sin', to obey God's laws, his mind not being blinded and his nature entirely free to accept God's ways - all concepts opposed by scripture. Hunt's premise is based on his own middle option logic.

The problem with the likes of Hunt and others who refuse to recognise the total inability of unsaved man is that reason and logic prevail over revelation. Man's wisdom arguably becomes greater than God's wisdom. Human logic is stronger, instead of a child-like dependance on the scriptures as they speak plainly on these matters. It then becomes man's own philosophical view that

God could not allow unsaved man to be so helpless in his own efforts and nature.

The Fall out... Evangelism and 'Grace'

Finally, there is a more serious side to this. A failure to accept and understand the inability of man has two detrimental results. One is in *evangelism*. Evangelism which sees man as having some ability and freedom from a sinful nature causes evangelistic methods to play on the *decisional power of man*. Methods are developed that play on the will of man apart from the *trust in the Holy Spirit changing the very nature of man* so as to be regenerated *in nature* (Born Again). Dependance on the Spirit is lessened. Modern semi-Pelagian and Arminian doctrines have led to a labyrinth of new evangelism techniques that *focus on man in the Gospel, lessen the enslavement of sin* and minimize the Gospel itself, which is not about man but about Christ's work to satisfy God for sinners *enslaved!*

Secondly, the understanding of 'Grace' is diminished. Grace as unmerited favour is minimised. An understanding of the inability of man to achieve salvation in and of himself should heighten the wonder of Grace that God should save any at all. Is it wholly 'a gift of God' or not (Eph.2:8)?

Human logic that works against scripture is dangerous. God's ways are not our ways. The two truths of the responsibility of man and the sovereign election of God cannot be changed with new or misunderstood terminology, brought together, or reasoned with any exclusive middle logic. The two truths must be held up. Teaching one against the other will cause a 'hyper view' of one.

God's reasoning

The illogic of doctrine is no excuse for inventing a new logic. It is humanly understandable that we would question and ask 'how can a man be saved if he has no ability within himself and is a willing slave to sin?' How can he be saved if 'no man can come' (Jn.6:44) and he 'cannot receive the things of the Spirit, neither can he know them' (1Cor.2:14) and he is 'not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be' (Rom.8:7,8)? The answer to this is not found in logical arguments that attempt to set one scripture against another or that propose to solve the logical impossibilities which is well evident in the scriptural truths revealing man's inability. The answer is to accept God's answer by faith: 'The things which are impossible with men are possible with God'!

'Total Inability' within man does not mean divine impossibility. God has perfected a sovereign divine Trinitarian plan to do what is 'impossible with men' but 'possible with God' - to save man, even in his inability. And this is where 'Grace' now takes on a whole new meaning! Grace is well defined in Ephesians 2:8,9: 'For by grace are you saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast'.

Editor's Comment:

This is a good question. Firstly, the answer is 'yes' - all should believe the same things because the Holy Spirit is not divided. But we are made up of Spirit and flesh. The Holy Spirit of God does not override our thought processes or our inclinations. The war between the flesh and the Spirit is evident (Rom.7:22-25). God does not override this battle between the flesh and the Spirit although he has provided all that is necessary for victory in Jesus by the Spirit within.

Secondly, many Christians do not take the Word of God as inspired and thus inerrant. God has provided us with what He says in HIS Word. If we accept that as literal truth and fact, we would believe the creation account in Genesis - and entertain no other explanation for the existence of everything. The fact that there is NO evidence of any species 'evolving' into something outside that species is arguably evidence enough for an intelligent person to see that evolution is impossible. Adaption for sure, but never evolution. The 2nd Law of Thermodynamics ensures that everything goes from order to chaos, from new to corruption over a period of time - whereas evolutionists claim that the opposite occurs given enough time - but the evidence of the truth of that law is obvious to an astute mind.

The same goes for the question of the Jews. If God has finished with them how is it that they are the *only* people to have been dispersed from their land and yet have remained as they always were, and now they are again the *only* nation to be regathered, with all the customs and language they held to 2,000 years ago? Further, scripture is replete with texts holding the promise from God Himself to restore Israel in the last days - *and return there* at His second coming.

There is also another reason for differing beliefs. Some Christians read the Word of God and interpret language as figurative or they spiritualise it; whereas others take the language to be literal unless it is obviously figurative. This issue of *interpretation* also causes differing views.

Do we believe the Bible is God's infallible inspired inerrant Word or not? Some Christians do; many do not or pay lip service to it only.

Thirdly, the question also is: Are these people Christian? Perhaps mostly - but disobedient ones who may well suffer loss at the judgement seat for their laziness with the scriptures? The Holy Spirit guides a genuine seeker into all truth - but He would never overrule our inclinations...which are only evil always? We can be disobedient in our flesh.

God is a rewarder of those who diligently seek him (Heb.11:6). However, such are becoming but a remnant today as the church falls into deeper apostasy. We have been led into all truth - but some choose to disbelieve it. The Holy Spirit illuminates the Word of God and teaches us from it - but if one does not study it then that person remains unenlightened.

There are some things I rejected when a young Christian (for example predestination/sovereign election, etc.) But on further and consistent study, in the light of understanding the inspiration of Scripture, I came to understand I must be obedient to what God says, not what my fleshly fallen human logic might reject. Hence a young or shallow Christian might reject things that are obvious in the Word of God. But again, it is often a matter of the flesh and/or disobedience, or a lack of study. The latter I do believe is sadly rampant in today's feel good, shallow, undisciplined Christianity. Such a lack of study will often keep people in the errors they have been taught in their early Christian life. The problem too is that many Christians simply do not know enough of the Word of God to have their minds changed from false beliefs.
